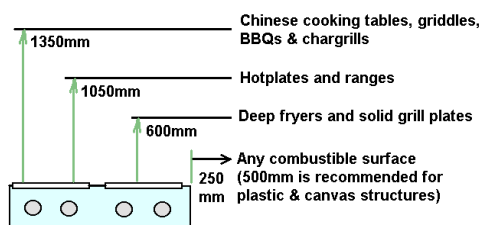

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Gas Standard

It is a requirement of the Society that all temporary gas installations comply with the Gas Act 2010.

The Office of the Technical Regulator raised the following non-compliance matters during a routine inspection:

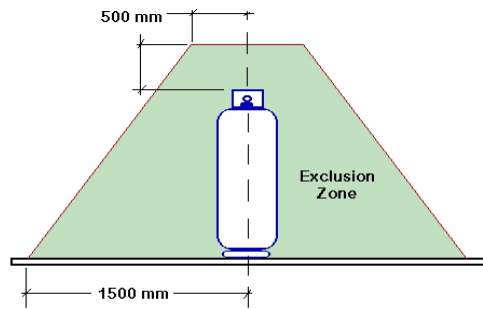
1. Manufactured (type A) gas appliances must be Certified by a recognized appliance certifier such as the Australian Gas Association AGA, Standards Australia International SA Global, International Association of Plumbing Mechanical Officials IAPMO and Global Mark GM to conform to the Gas Act 2010. Appliances that are not certified must undergo individual safety assessment with a recognized application certifier. The OTR recognizes Gassupport Services P/L to individually assess and certify uncertified type A gas appliances. Gassupport can be contacted on 0408 417 461.
2. Over pressure protection is to be provided by the LPG regulator on temporary or fixed installations.
3. 'External' appliances must not be used indoors (e.g. BBQ's or patio heaters certified and labeled for outdoor use). Outdoor appliances can be used under a covered area providing the area is open to atmosphere on 2 sides i.e. (50%) of the total area to ensure effective cross flow ventilation.
4. Location of gas appliances in relation to adjacent combustible materials. Overhead and side clearances from gas appliances to combustible materials should be provided as per the following recommendations.



5. Damage to flexible hose assemblies. Flexible hose assemblies should be replaced every 5 years. Check all hoses for cracks, mechanical or heat damage, hardening or bulging. The rubber 'O' Ring or dome seal on the POL / cylinder fitting should also be checked for cracks or damage and replaced where damaged. Test all cylinder connections and exposed joints with soapy water solution to ensure that no gas leaks exist before operating the appliances.
6. Damage to fixed copper gas pipes. Visually check that gas lines are not damaged. Have a licensed gasfitter rectify any faults.
7. Inadequate support and protection for temporary gas services against mechanical / heat damager and tripping hazards.
8. Maintain and use your gas appliances as per the manufacturer's instructions. If a fault occurs contact a licensed gasfitter to have it repaired.
9. **LPG gas cylinders**
10. Gas cylinders must not be damaged, rusty or over 10 years old.
11. LPG cylinders should not be stored on their sides. Cylinders must be secured upright on a non combustible base with the cylinder relief's facing away from structures and other cylinders.
12. LPG cylinders located in poorly ventilated confined spaces. Cylinders must not be located in poorly ventilated areas that could contain any gas leakage.
13. LPG cylinders located too close to ignition sources. LPG gas cylinders need to be located at least 1500mm away from ignition sources such as electrical switchboards, power points, generators and naked flames.

14. Incorrect placement of LPG cylinders indoors. **For safety reasons the use and storage of cylinders of LPG Gas indoors should be avoided wherever practical. The OTR recommends that cylinders be used and stored outdoors.** Where LPG cylinders are used / stored indoors the quantities must not exceed the limits set out in table 2.1 or clause 4.4.4.2 from AS/NZS 5601.2 2010.

Extract from AS/NZS 5601.2 2010

Table 2.1

Protected places and public places: —Outdoors, including open air, temporary structures (e.g. marquees, tents, booths) and under awnings —Outdoor areas of hotels, restaurants, cafes and take-away food shops (see Figure 2.1) —Indoors, within buildings with a roof and three or more walls, e.g. hotels, bars, restaurants, cafes, take-away food shops	Per site: Maximum total quantity: 60 kg (see also Clause 2.4 and Figure 2.2) Maximum cylinder size: 15 kg 10 kg per 10 m ² floor area, up to a maximum total quantity of 30 kg Maximum cylinder size: 15 kg
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4.4.4.2 Volumes of LP Gas indoors—Cylinders

The following volumes and restrictions shall apply to LP Gas cylinders in use indoors in factories, warehouses and exhibition centres:

- Where the floor area is less than or equal to 200 m², the above extract table 2.1 applies.
- Where the floor area is greater than 200 m², a maximum volume of 500 L (water capacity) of LP Gas per 200 m² of floor area applies.
- Such groups of cylinders (as described in Item (b)) shall be separated by at least 15 m. Cylinders in such groups need not be manifolded, and may supply different consuming appliances.

Prior to the commencement of any event a Society representative may be making random inspections of all areas to ensure compliance with the Act. Please also be aware that the OTR and SafeWork SA may be making random inspections.

Note gas incidents must be reported to the Society who will contact SafeWork SA & the OTR.
